Scrap Ban China

- Chinese Government motivation is environmental protection and concerns over standards within
- U.S. to China export of scrap is a \$5.2 Billion industry
- 24% of U.S. was sent to China in 2015
- Business opportunity for Illinois processers
- Resiliency concerns for municipalities and haulers

What does the ban cover?

- eight types of postconsumer plastic scrap
- one type of unsorted scrap paper
- 11 types of used or scrap textile materials
- four types of metal slag that contain vanadium

ISRI Issues WTO Response to China's Scrap Ban on Behalf of Recycling Industry

(Washington, DC) - The Institute of Scrap Recycling Industries (ISRI) today announced it filed comments with the World Trade Organization (WTO) in response to China's intent to ban certain scrap imports. As the Voice of the Recycling Industry ™, ISRI supports free and fair trade and opposes measures that restrict the free flow of specification-grade commodities around the world. In an effort to prevent imported waste from polluting the environment, China's ban on "solid waste" will have a negative economic impact on the recycling industries in the United States and China, the manufacturing sector in China that relies on these highly valuable commodities and the environmental sustainability opportunities from the use of recyclable materials in China. ISRI is requesting a revision of the policy to avail the disruption in trade as well as electification of the page seens.

Two dozen types of scrap imports banned by China in 2018

Mid-August document prohibits postconsumer plastic and one type of unsorted paper; industrially generated plastic scrap remains permissible.
